ETT Strand: You Have Value

**Aim:** Students learn about their ancestors and record their knowledge in the the footprint provided.

**End Result:** Create a trail of footprints around the classroom, displaying each students ancestral footprint. Try to get the same amound of right feet and left feet distributed amongst the students. There are text pages included which can be added to the display to give context.

### **Suggested questions to prompt students:**

- Is there someone in your past you feel connected to?
- · Is it a grandparent or great grandparent?
- Can you go back further into your family tree and find someone in your distant past?
- · What do you know about this person?
- · Where and when did they live?
- · What do you notice about your connection to them?






### Whose footsteps do you follow in?

Fill the footprint with all you know about your ancestor.


